Dear Westside Community Center Neighbors & Guests,
Effective Friday, November 13, 2020, El Paso County will move to “Safer at Home Level 3,” in response to the rapidly rising spread of COVID-19. As a city facility, and as one who shares our community’s commitment to public health, we remain committed to complying with current restrictions that are aimed at combating the spread of this virus. As such, the Westside Community Center be limiting the programs, services and events taking place on our campus. Current restrictions include the following measures:

- Any events or programs on campus will be limited to 25% capacity of room it occupies; details on each room’s capacity can be obtained by calling our Main Office. Activities in Hughes Hall, such as Pickleball, Ping Pong will be limited to 20 persons.
- In addition to masks, temperature checks will be required for any person entering any WCC facility.
- Westside Cares will continue to offer food boxes to those struggling with basic food essentials each Wednesday. Should you need access to food through Westside Cares, please contact their main office at 2808 W. Colorado Ave. or by calling 719-389-0759.
- Silver Key will continue to offer pre-packaged “grab-n-go” meals for seniors through our Connections Café weekly. Seniors in need of meals can pull into our parking lot, and our Café team will deliver them to car windows. - Our playground will remain open, barring further restrictions. Please help our neighborhood’s children feel safe and welcome at our playground by picking up pet waste.

During this very difficult time as a community, please know that we remain committed to doing all we can to re-establish meaningful community connections when we are allowed to resume normal operations. Our mutual commitment to safety and community health guidelines will help bring that day about more quickly, so let’s work together to endure this season with patience, knowing that the sun will shine on us again very soon.
